We are told repeatedly that the Founding Fathers of our country did not have God in mind when they laid the foundational principles that would be incorporated into the constitution. Those who make such claims are counting on the masses to accept the propaganda without ever reading the words of the Founding Fathers themselves. One specific case is the so-called separation of church and state. It is not found in the constitution. The First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads: *"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof...."* *The Constitution intended to keep the State out of religion not religion out of the State.*

The phrase "separation of church and state" is generally traced to a January 1, 1802 letter by Thomas Jefferson, addressed to the Danbury Baptist Association in Connecticut, and published in a Massachusetts newspaper. Jefferson wrote,

Jefferson was echoing the language of the founder of the first Baptist church in America, Roger Williams who had written in 1644, "[A] hedge or wall of separation between the garden of the church and the wilderness of the world."

Did the Founding Fathers intend for religion and the State remain apart without the former influencing the latter? Let's look at a few quotes and you decide.

- *The highest glory of the American Revolution was this: that it connected, in one indissoluble bond, the principles of civil government with the principles of Christianity.* - John Quincy Adams
- *Providence has given to our people the choice of their rulers and it is the duty as well as the privilege and interest, of a Christian nation to select and prefer Christians for their rulers.* - John Jay, one of the three men most responsible for the Constitution
- *Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people...it is wholly inadequate to the government of any other.* - John Adams
- *He who shall introduce into public affairs the principles of Christianity will change the face of the world.* - Benjamin Franklin, 1774, Ambassador to France
- *It cannot be emphasized too strongly or too often that this great nation was founded, not by religionists, but by Christians, not on religions, but on the gospel of Jesus Christ!* - Patrick Henry

The French writer Alexis de Tocqueville, after visiting America in 1831, said, "America is great because America is good, and if America ever ceases to be good, America will cease to be great!"

And from where does goodness ultimate come? It is derived from godly principles embedded in Scripture. Think about that on this 4th of July week. Think about the condition of the State without Christian influence. Happy birthday America!
